



Water Truck Driver

Lone Rock Resources has an opening for Truck Driver. The successful candidate will perform in a production setting as a Class A CDL driver. Lone Rock is a family owned timber company with a proud past and a bright future. Currently the company owns and manages 135,000 acres of timberland in SW Oregon. The company’s primary business is producing and selling timber from this property. Lone Rocks Trucking Department provides various transportation services to many departments within the company.

JOB DESCRIPTION: *This is a temporary seasonal, hourly position.* This job requires driving a 4-axle, 4,000-gallon water truck some times in combination with tilt deck equipment trailers. There are two primary functions of this position. The first being, mobilization of company equipment on two and three axle tilt deck trailers in support of our road construction operations. Secondly, this truck will be utilized to haul water to our surfacing jobs. Work schedules may vary and are reflective of the duties being performed. General work days will be Monday through Friday with occasional weekends. Estimated hours per week will be 50-60. Other miscellaneous duties may be assigned as needed. This job is seasonal and is estimated to be 6 months in length each year during the summer construction season. On an average year, this will be May through November. There is the possibility of extended work outside the construction season during certain years but is not guaranteed.

GENERAL JOB REQUIREMENTS:

- A proven ability and desire to be a team player. It is essential to work well with others and maintain a positive attitude at work. We work as a cohesive unit to provide the best service to the company as possible. This means carrying out tasks and making decisions for the good of the company as opposed to putting individuals first.
- Class A CDL License with tank endorsement
- Capable of safely hauling gross loads of up to 100,000 lbs.
- Must have an acceptable driving history with regards to moving violations and drug/alcohol screening
- Must have a minimum of 2-years CDL driving on forest roads within the Pacific Northwest in either a dump truck, water truck, log truck, or lowboy
- Prior experience with tilt deck, ramp, or lowboy equipment trailers is a plus.
- Experience or willingness to learn how to safely load and unload small to midsized construction equipment onto tilt deck trailers
- Willingness to work variable and changing schedules as job duties may require, primarily 5 days per week but at times up to 7 days straight. Typical hours per day is 10 to 12 with peaks of 14.
- The ability to have variable starting schedules as early as 2am in the morning

- Good listening and verbal communication skills
- A general understanding of driver's hours of service rules as they apply to Intrastate and short haul exemption hauling
- A working understanding or the ability to learn weight configurations, permit requirements, and load securement procedures as they apply to dump trucks and tilt deck trailers.
- Experience with and/or the ability to learn to use an electronic logging device (ELD) in the truck for tracking daily trip records and time
- Willing to work in a safe manner and adhere to general company safety policies as well as State & Federal Motor Carrier safety rules
- demonstrate pride in keeping keep truck clean and in good working order. This requires dedicated hours each week for inspecting, maintaining, and washing your truck
- Ability to communicate both electronically and verbally with a mechanic for necessary repairs on the truck
- Willingness to complete other duties as assigned approximately 5% of the time. This may include fighting efforts or other manual labor tasks in assistance to our construction operations may be necessary a small amount of the time.
